To recognise the annual RUOK? Day (Thursday, 14 September 2023) the School Wellbeing Team organised special activities for Staff and students, to raise awareness around wellbeing, bring attention to the importance of keeping an eye on one another, and to ask the question "RUOK?". Group activities included a BBQ sausage (or hotdog) lunch in the Community Garden, where Staff and students came together, to inspire and empower everyone to connect with different people around them and to start conversations. In the week leading up to RUOK? Day, all students were able to get involved in a rock painting activity, whereby they could decorate a rock and include a message of positivity and hope, to be placed in the gardens around the school for other students to find and enjoy. The Wellbeing Team felt this idea as an opportunity to add something to the school environment that continued to show the importance of "checking in" whilst also providing students who may be struggling with a message of hope and positivity. In the days afterwards, many students have been seen picking the rocks up, reading the message, enjoying the creativity of others and sharing the messages with those around them. Students were also given the opportunity to "wear a splash of yellow" for a gold coin donation. While RUOK? YEAR 11 AGRICULTURE EXCURSION





The Year 11 Agriculture class visited the UDC (Union Dairy Company) powdered milk plant at Penola, on Friday, 15 September 2023. Accompanied by Mrs Tulak and Mr Berlin, the students had a tour of the plant, learning about the production and packing of powdered milk and Anhydrous Milk Fat (AMF) products. By seeing the amazing automation first-hand at work within the plant, this assists the students to understand the role of technology in agriculture production. The plant is "a state-of-the-art milk processing facility and one of the newest in the southern hemisphere. With an annual processing capacity of 300 million litres of raw milk, the purpose-built factory incorporates a variety of product-specific plants."* The students were very fortunate to have the opportunity to visit the plant to enrich their agricultural studies and are very thankful to the team at UDC.

SCHOOL VOLUNTEER - MANDATORY TRAINING

For any person (eg parent, caregiver, friend, relative, community member) to work as a volunteer with children or young people, there is some mandatory training that is required, prior to volunteer work taking place. One such training requirement is **RRHAN** training - **RRHAN** is an acronym for **R**esponding to **R**isk of **H**arm, **A**buse and **N**eglect.



A free RRHAN course (for volunteers) has been arranged at School for anyone interested. The two hour session will commence at 1.15 pm on Tuesday 26 September 2023. With this type of training becoming mandatory to volunteer in many workplaces and government organisations, this is an ideal opportunity to tick this training off. STATE TRACK AND FIELD CHAMPIONSHIPS









AEAS students Zach Howard, Kade Grosvenor, Oliver Fox and Max Pitson recently represented the School and the Lower South East, when competing at the State Track and Field Championship in Adelaide (Monday, 16 September 2023), as members of the Lower South East Track and Field Athletics Team. Zach (first image left) had a successful meet; 100m sprint (3rd), 200m sprint (2nd), high jump (2nd) and was a member of the Under 10 relay team (4th) and a member of the Under 11 relay team, which placed 1st in one of the heats. Due to the number of Under 11 relay teams, the fastest times in the heats dictated the final placings (overall 4th place). Kade (second image left) participated in the shotput and placed 7th. It has been reported that Kade really enjoyed the experience, displaying great sportsmanship and cheering on his team-mates. Max (third image left) ran in the 100m sprint in an eyecatching performance, finishing a very close 2nd in the Division One - 100 m final with a time of 14.53 seconds, just ahead of teammate Zac Howard (3rd place). Oliver (fourth image left) competed in long jump placing 4th and the high jump event placing 5th. Highlights of Oliver's experience was seeing so many great young athletes and making plenty of new friendships. We are certainly proud of the four students, both in their initial selection and also their performances in Adelaide. AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIP NOMINATION

Following his selection in the Lower South East Track and Field team, which competed at the School Sport SA Track and Field State Championship in Adelaide, student **Max Pitson** has been nominated for South Australian team selection to compete at the School Sport Australia Championship. Max's nomination is based on his personal State Championship results, where he finished a close second in the Division One - 100m final (14.53 seconds) and comparisons to the historical average of individual event results from previous Australian Championships. The Australian Championship event will be held on 23-27 November 2023 in Launceston, Tasmania, with Max aiming to compete in the 100m sprint. He may also have the opportunity to qualify for additional events, which include the 200m sprint and 4 x 100 m relay. Congratulations to Max on his nomination and wishing him all the best with final selection and the Championship.




SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY EVENT
