You may have seen in local print media, the exciting partnership between the AEAS and the District Council of Grant ("Council"), in an effort to highlight the issues and raise environmental awareness, in relation to waste disposal and using specifically designated bins around the ocean in a bid to protect sea life. Three sign installations have been developed and installed at the Port MacDonnell and

Blackfellows Caves boat ramps, with each sign incorporating artwork created by AEAS students of all ages, which convey environmental messaging. In addition to the inclusion of student artwork, the new signage also includes messaging regarding the general use of the boat ramp and the new digital boat ramp permit system, which has now replaced the physical boat ramp ticketing machines. The official unveiling of the new signage took place on Wednesday, 27 September 2023 at Port MacDonnell, with School Environmental Committee students (Tanner Jones, Milah Staples, Mya Coutts, Emily Osborne, Flint Jones), Assistant Principal Suzie Mitchell, teachers Sarah Stratford and Thomas Male and past AEAS Environmental Committee member Hudson Terrick joining Mayor Kylie Boston, Deputy Mayor Megan Dukalskis and several executive Council members at the ceremony. This collaborative venture is certainly something that the School can be proud of, with Mayor Boston acknowledging the importance of

continual engagement with young people and seeing classroom

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OUTDOOR EDUCATION CAMP

Accompanied by teachers Mark Rumbelow, Rob Berlin and SSO Sarah Ritter, a group of our secondary students have participated in a two day bushwalking camp in the Grampians National Park (25-26 September 2023). The bush walk started at the Cassidy Gap Road trailhead, with the trekkers firstly walking up Signal Peak (780m above sea level) and then Mount Abrupt (823m above sea level), before setting up camp at the Mud-Dadjug campsite. The following day, the group made their way down from Mud-Dadjug to the meeting point, the Piccaninny carpark where the group was collected and returned to School. In total, the bush walkers covered approximately 13 kilometres over steep and difficult terrain, which was a huge achievement. The views were spectacular and well worth the fatigued legs and sore shoulders, although some may disagree.


NEW STAFF MEMBER

SAPSASA GOLF - BOYS STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

During Term 2, AEAS student Oliver (Oli) Fox competed in the SAPSASA golf Lower South East qualifying day at the Penola golf course. Oli's score from this event then allowed him to proceed to the SAPSASA South East qualifying day at Naracoorte, against other school students from the Lower, Mid and Upper South East. Over the course of the day, the players attended skill development sessions (chipping, putting, pitching and long game practice), prior to a nine hole golf round on a modified course. Oli and eight other students then qualified to represent the South East in the 12&Under State Championship. Held at the West Beach Parks course (7-8 September 2023), 124 players competed at the Championship on the short course, with Oli finishing the event in a very credible 19th position with a score of 70, a 6 shot improvement from his first day.
